WAG Grand Prix Series Handbook

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General Grand Prix Information

Gymnastics NSW is excited to introduce the NSW WAG Grand Prix Series for 2025.

In 2025 GNSW will launch the inaugural WAG Level 1-4 Grand Prix Series. The Grand Prix Series will incorporate 3 designated Grand Prix events, as well as including Region Team Selection trials, the Region State Championships and State Levels Championships.

The series' focus is the provision of additional competition opportunities and the promotion of a friendly competition spirit between clubs, as clubs accumulate points for overall club rankings at the conclusion of the series.

Athletes and clubs will compete together across the series, with clubs allocated to competition leagues to determine the League Champions for 2025.

Qualification

Region events will have no qualification requirements. Region events will be open to clubs and athletes from within the Region. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt up to the maximum capacity for the event.

Grand Prix events will have no qualification requirements. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt up to the maximum capacity for the event.

State Championships qualification and entry requirements are as per the NSW Technical Regulations. To attend the Region State Championships, athletes must be selected to their Region team through competing in the Regions State Trial competition, in accordance with the Region team selection policy. No qualifying score nor minimum score is required.

Points System Summary

Points across the series will be earned for event participation and competitive results.

Region Trials

- Clubs will earn Grand Prix Participation Points
- Clubs and athletes can attend multiple region competitions throughout the year. There is no participation limit.
- Clubs and athletes can earn Grand Prix points only once for a Region event.
- No ranking GP points are available at Region Trial Competitions.

Club participation	10 points per level per club	For each level the club has athletes competing in a Region competition, the club will earn 10 Grand Prix points i.e. Level 1, Level 2, Level 3, Level 4, State Level 3 and State Level 4	Max. 60 points
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Points can be earned for participation across multiple events, for example competing in Level 3 and 4 in one competition and competing in Levels 1 and 2 at a different competition.

Athletes must actually compete in the competition for the club and athlete to be eligible for points.

Clubs can only earn club participation points once for each Level. For example, if the club has athletes competing in Level 3 at one competition and enters another region competition also in Level 3 (even if they are different athletes), they can only earn a maximum of 10 club participation points for Level 3.

Athlete Participation	1 point per competing athlete at a region event.	For athlete the club has competing in a Region competition, the club will earn 1 Grand Prix point.
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Maximum 1 point per individual athlete, even if the athlete participates in multiple region events.

Athlete participation in the region events must be in a level within the WAG Grand Prix series.

Athletes can only earn a maximum of 1 point for participation for their club, even if they were to compete in 2 different levels across the grand prix series.

Grand Prix Competitions

Clubs and athletes will be grouped at the event into sessions. Session structure will be determined by event requirements, and the individual structure may be different from event to event.

The session size, mix of clubs, leagues and in some-cases levels will be determined on a case-by-case basis in the best interest of the event, the event participants, as well as fairness and equity.

Wherever possible, clubs/athletes within the same allocated league will be grouped together.

Wherever possible, sessions for Levels 3-4 (ALP and State Levels) will consist of approximately 50 athletes.

Wherever possible, levels within the competition will be grouped together within the same session.

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Foundations 1-2

Competition structure for Foundations levels will remain unchanged.

A tally of each athletes awards/banding will be taken to determine an overall band. The athletes overall band will determine the number of Grand Prix points the athlete earns for their club.

Please note: The Competition Leagues will be reviewed throughout the competition series in 2025. Clubs may be moved into a different overall competitive league based on the engagement and participation levels across each league in the initial year. Any variation to the composition of each competitive league will be at the complete discretion of GNSW in the interest of fairness, equity and a positive series experience. Applications from clubs to change leagues will not be considered.

Overall Awards

A Champion Overall Club for each of the 6 Leagues will be presented at the end of the series.

Clubs must have participated in a minimum of 3 events within the series (one of these events must be a Grand Prix event) to be eligible for an Overall Grand Prix Champion Club. If no club within a league has achieved this criteria, the overall award for that league may not be presented.

The top 3 clubs per league will be recognised at the conclusion of the series.

Various additional awards will be available throughout the series, with details of these communicated to clubs leading into the events.
