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General Information

Technical Regulations Purpose

This is to be read in conjunction with the [GNSW General Regulations Section](#).

The FIG Code of Points and Technical Regulations, and the Gymnastics Australia Technical Regulations provide governance for Women's Artistic Gymnastics (WAG). This handbook provides WAG in NSW with general and program information, technical regulations, event information and selection process, policies and forms.

The WAG Gymsport Committee shall be master of its own procedures.

Where any event occurs that is not elsewhere provided in these regulations, any decision or action required shall be decided by a simple majority vote of the Committee, whose determination of the matter shall be final and not to be construed as having set a precedent.

Whereby error or omission any of the foregoing regulations shall require interpretation, the original intent of the Committee in the framing of the subject regulation shall prevail, rather than the letter of the law.

The ALP provides one pathway for gymnasts, comprised of:

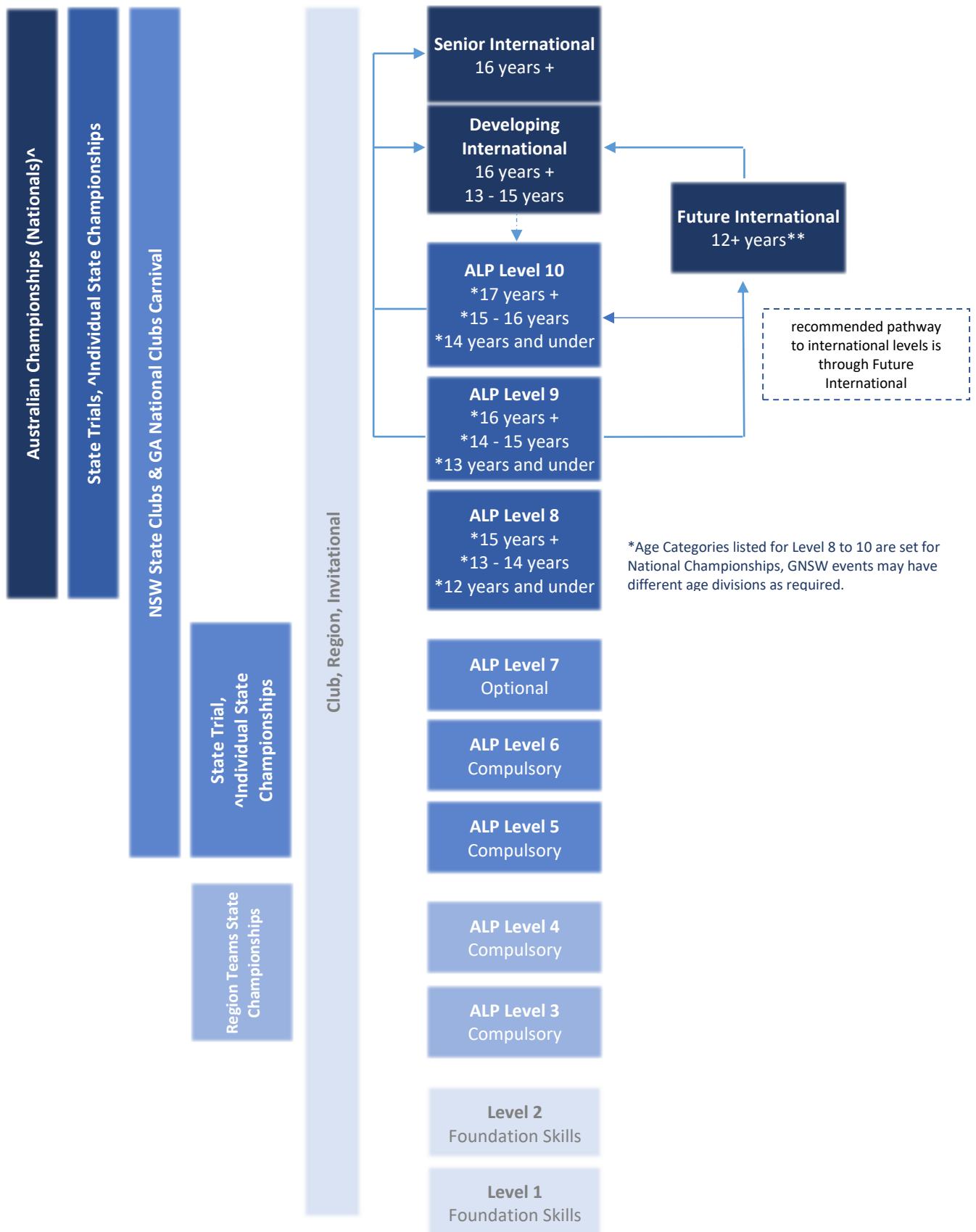
- Foundation Program - Levels 1 & 2
- Compulsory Levels - Levels 3 - 6
- Optional Levels - Levels 7 – 10, Future International

The progression from Future International leads to the Developing and Senior International levels governed by the FIG Code of Points.

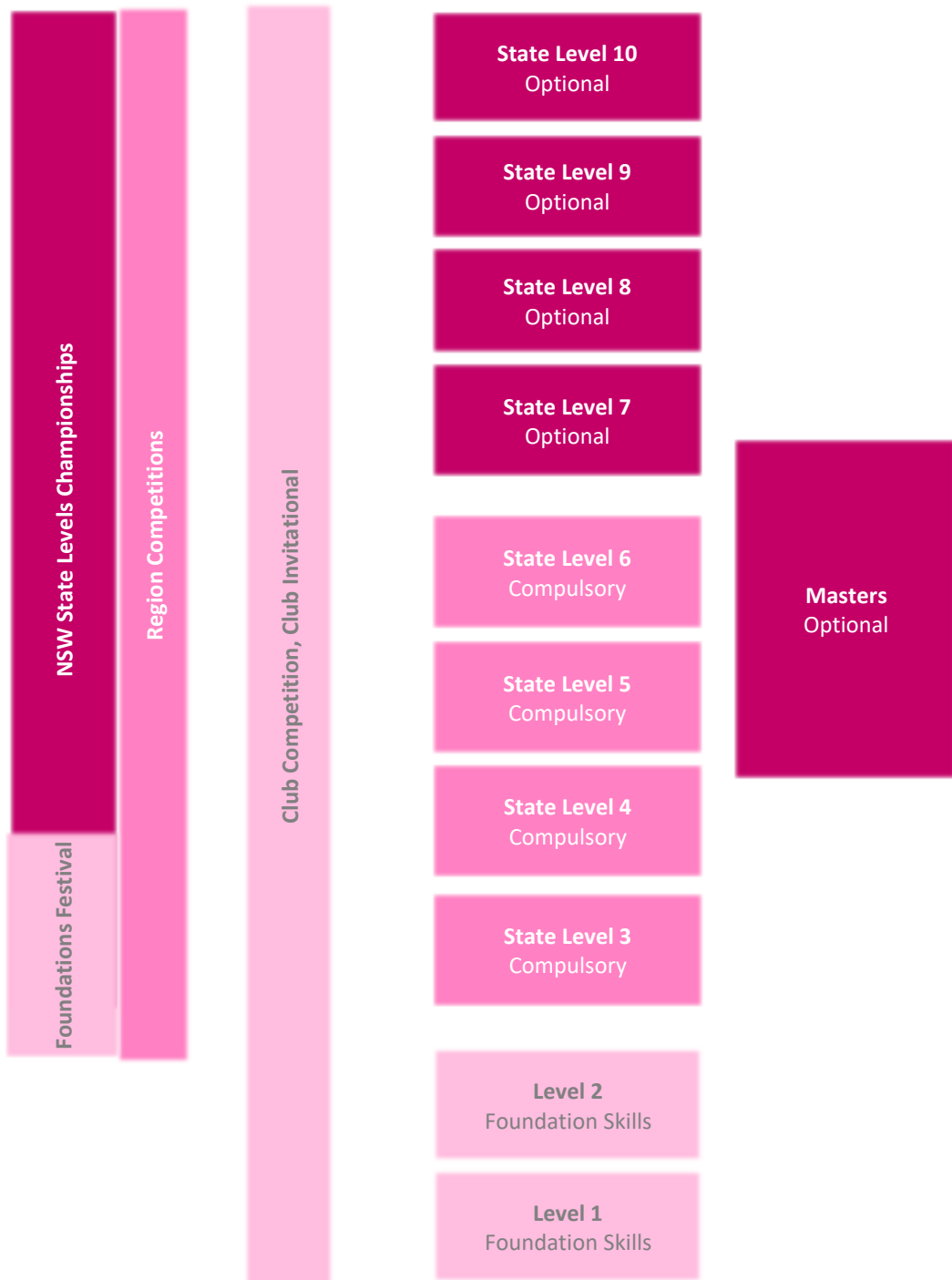
NSW ALP Competition Framework

Judges must meet the dress requirements as listed in the WAG CoP & ALP.

Additional Athlete Regulations

Progression and Transitions

Clubs and coaches will have the flexibility to be able to allocate gymnasts into the level they deem most appropriate for the gymnast. This will mean that in the event it is most appropriate for a gymnast to potentially compete in a level lower than the level they have previously competed this will not require any approval. We trust that coaches will act in the best interest of the gymnast.

Where a gymnast has competed in one competition during the current competition season at a Gymnastics NSW qualification or state-run event (including Region competitions), a change down in levels for subsequent competitions within the season will only be permitted if the athlete has not achieved the pass mark as outlined in the Gymnastics Australia Technical Regulations. Only one individual State Championships is permitted within the calendar year, with the exemption of Levels 8-10 who may also choose to attend the State Levels Championships. Gymnasts in Future, Junior and Senior International who will not continue to follow the international pathway will be required to transfer to the appropriate level as outlined in the Gymnastics Australia Technical Regulations.

Event Information

Competition Equipment

All equipment allowed for competition will be supplied at the apparatus. Additional matting, springboards and other equipment will **not** be permitted to be moved to or from an apparatus without consent of the WAG EPPO or Event Manager.

Apparatus Requirements

For the current specifications please refer to the latest Australian Levels Program, Gymnastics Australia WAG Technical Regulations and FIG Apparatus Norms. Please also note the below:

The hard section of the vault run will be as available at the venue for Gymnastics NSW events and will likely be approx. 3.2m long in line with the manufacturer's specifications.

Level's 3 and 4 will have a minimum vault run length of 15m. Vault run may be longer depending on venue and competition requirements.



The length of Soft Landing mats (crash mats) will be as per the manufacturers specifications. Due to matting changes internationally, for most events this will be 3.0m.

All beam heights at GNSW events will be set at the minimum stated height. Applications to raise the bars are required to be submitted on the entry form.

Music Requirements

All compulsory music will be provided by GNSW for use at GNSW run competitions.

Music for L 7 - 10 and Future, Junior and Senior - must be submitted via the [JotForm](#).

Warm-up Regulations

- Please refer to Australian Levels Manual and the FIG Code of Points for warm-up regulations.
- Each competing gymnast is entitled to a touch warm-up period immediately prior to the competition on all apparatus in accordance with the Technical Regulations that govern that competition.
- 30 seconds on all apparatus except Uneven Bars, minimum of 2 vaults.
- 50 seconds on Uneven Bars - includes bar preparation.
- In team competitions the entire warm-up time belongs to the team. The team must pay attention to the elapsed time, so that the last gymnast receives a warm-up.
- In mixed groups the warm-up time belongs personally to the gymnast. The order of warm-up should be the same as the order of competition, unless there are apparatus alterations or other extenuating circumstances.
- If a gymnast is still on the apparatus when the judges signal the end of the warm-up period, they may complete the element or sequence started. Following the warm-up period or during the 'competition pause', the apparatus may be prepared but not used.
- There will be a signal to start from the Head Judge 30 seconds before their exercise is expected to begin.
- Team warm-up and order only apply to the State Club Championships.

Floor - 30 secs per gymnast or up to a maximum of 3 mins

Level 6 - Warm Up / Compete

Vault - 2 Vaults

Bars - maximum 2 touches (does not include bar preparation)

Beam - 45 seconds (may be done on a different beam)

Floor - 30 secs per gymnast or up to a maximum of 3 mins

Level 7 (May be Warmup/compete or Podium warm up depending on competition format and advised when timetable is released). Bars and Beam will have American warm-up (2 warm-up, 1 compete).

Warm-up / Compete

Vault - 2 Vaults

Bars - maximum 2 touches (does not include bar preparation)

Beam - 1 Minute per gymnast (not accumulated where there are multiple gymnasts from one club, can get on and off the apparatus multiple times within the minute)

Floor - 30 secs per gymnast or up to a maximum of 3 mins

OR

Podium Warm Up + One touch warm-up

Vault - 2 Vaults

Bars - 1 Touch (50 seconds max)

Beam - 30 Seconds

Floor - 3 minutes allocated to the group - max 8

Levels 8- 10, Future, Developing and Senior International

Podium Warm Up + One touch warm-up

Vault - 2 Vaults (Junior and Senior Int if competing 2 vaults - 3 vaults)

Bars - 1 Touch

Beam - 30 Seconds

Floor - 3 minutes allocated to the group - max 8

Please Note: additional warmup may be provided at the discretion of the panel and event organisers where appropriate



Coach Requirements

Clubs must provide at least 1 coach for each group of gymnasts on the floor during a session. This means that if a club has gymnasts in 2 groups during 1 session they need to provide at least 2 coaches.

If clubs have more than 6 gymnasts in a group then they need to provide at least 2 coaches for that group and may be required to move part of the group on as requested during the competition.

Coach Assistance

For Levels 3 - 6 coaches must stand in between the bars to spot the routines for Bars. In all other cases, the regulations indicated in the CoP or ALP will apply to coaches on the podium and spotting skills.

Score Queries

Coaches are allowed to query the D-Score of a gymnast's routine by completing the Query sheet available from the Jury and returning the completed form to them. This must be done in a timely manner after the display of the D-Score.

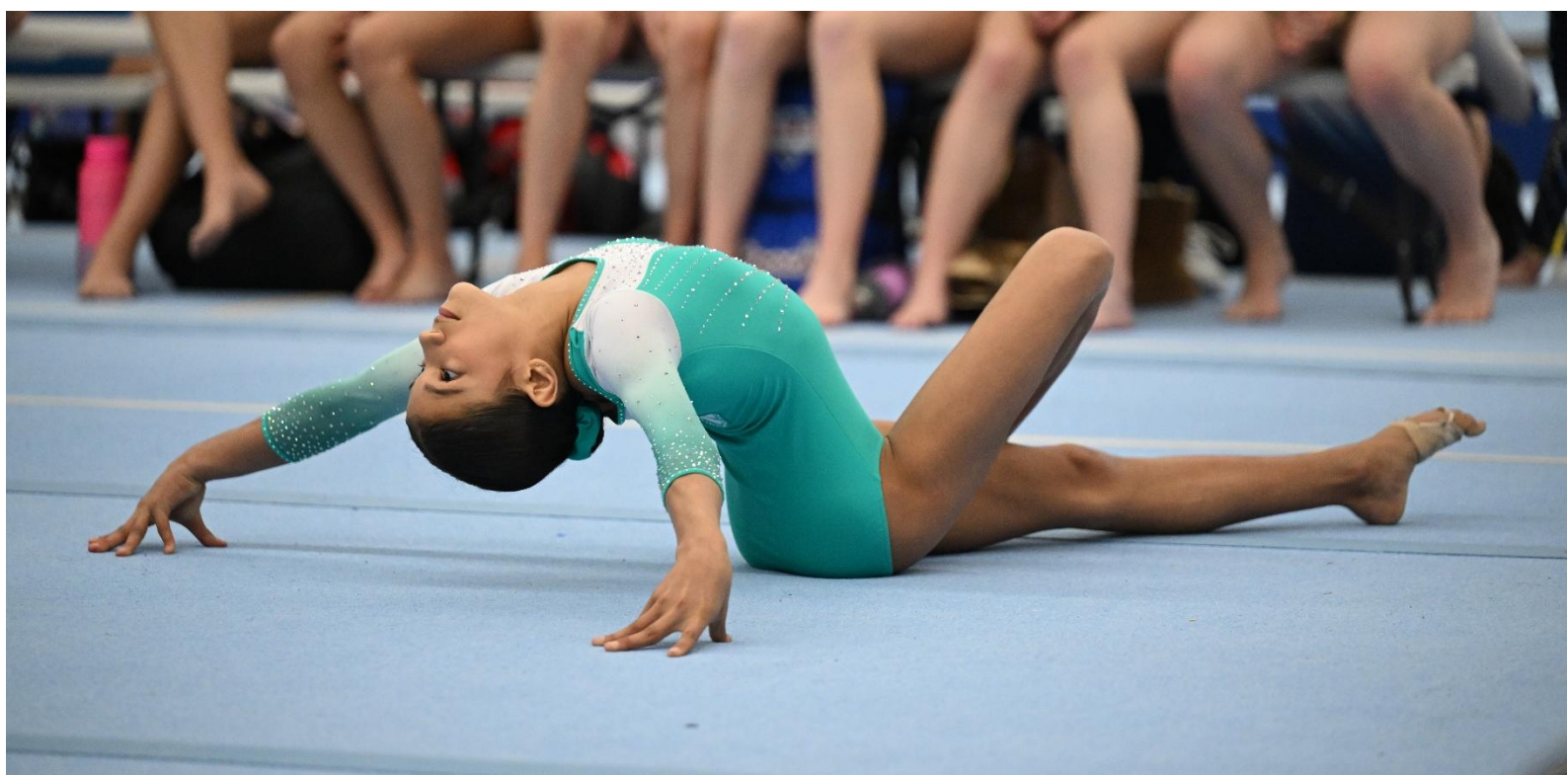

Selection Criteria

Please refer to the Gymnastics NSW Selection Policy covering eligibility criteria, selection requirements and roles and responsibilities available on the GNSW website and [GNSW State Team Website](#). WAG specific selection criteria can be found below.

Any combination of the gymnast's top two (2) All Around scores from Trial 1, Trial 2 or State Championships, will be combined to determine the gymnast's ranking. The qualification scores will be as per the Gymnastics Australia requirements in the 2025 Technical Regulations Part B for all levels.

Level 8 & Level 9

Level 8 Under*

At the conclusion of the Senior State Championships the top 6 ranked gymnasts aged 12 years and under in Level 8 from the above criteria will be announced in the Level 8 Under team.

Level 8 Open

At the conclusion of the Senior State Championships the top 8 ranked gymnasts aged 13 years and over in Level 8 from the above criteria will be announced in the Level 8 Open team. A minimum of 2 gymnasts per age division for the Australian Championships (13-14 & 15+ years) will be selected with the remaining positions to be selected based on the Selection Criteria above, regardless of age.

Two non-travelling reserves in Level 8 will be named, being the next 2 ranked gymnasts.

Level 9 Under*

At the conclusion of the Senior State Championships the top 6 ranked gymnasts aged 13 years and under in Level 9 from the above criteria will be announced in the Level 9 Under team.

Level 9 Open

At the conclusion of the Senior State Championships the top 8 ranked gymnasts aged 14 years and over in Level 9 from the above criteria will be announced in the Level 9 Open team. A minimum of 2 gymnasts per age division for the Australian Championships (14-15 & 16+ years) will be selected with the remaining positions to be selected based on the Selection Criteria above, regardless of age.

** If a STA has less than 3 athletes in the Level 8 under and or Level 9 under division and cannot make a team, gymnasts from the under divisions may be included in the open team.*

Two non-travelling reserves in Level 9 will be named, being the next 2 ranked gymnasts.



Level 10 and Future International

At the conclusion of the Senior State Championships the top 6 gymnasts in Level 10 and Future International from the above criteria will be announced in the team (pending achieving the required qualification score where applicable - please see below).

An injury petition for a Level 10 or Future International gymnast only who did not compete in the state trials may be submitted for consideration, however the gymnast must have competed at the State Championships and placed in the top 6 AA for the injury petition to be considered. Injury petition would only be considered in the event the gymnast does not have two counting scores. An accepted injury petition would replace the lowest ranked gymnast (e.g. if one injury petition were accepted the gymnast would replace 6th place or if two were accepted, they would replace 5th and 6th etc.).

In Level 10 and International Levels additional athletes may attend as long as they meet the qualifying requirements as detailed in the Gymnastics Australia WAG Technical Regulations Part B and/or Gymnastics NSW state team requirements.

Developing and Senior International

Pending achieving the required qualification score as listed in the Gymnastics Australia WAG Technical Regulations Part B and/or meeting the Gymnastics NSW state team requirements, following the conclusion of the Senior State Championships the selection committee will determine the selected teams for Developing and Senior International taking into consideration the results from Trial 1, Trial 2, State Championships, any relevant interstate and international competitions and VSA's. Clubs will be notified post event of the teams selected. Clubs may submit a petition for gymnasts in Developing and Senior who are unable to compete at the minimum number of events required for selection. The petition will be assessed on the merits of the athlete's performance at these events or any other relevant event. Petitions must be submitted at or before the final selection event.

The selection for the Developing and Senior International teams will be determined by the Selection Committee, taking into consideration the gymnast's ability to contribute to the team in the following order of priority:

- Contribute to the Team Score
- Gain an Apparatus and/or AA Medal



- Injury Petitions

In Developing and Senior International additional athletes may attend the Australian Championships as long as they meet the qualifying requirements as detailed in the Gymnastics Australia WAG Technical Regulations Part B and/or Gymnastics NSW state team requirements.

Where there is a tie for gymnasts eligible to attend Nationals, selection of the final place will be made by the Selection Committee taking into account the gymnast's ability to contribute to the NSW Team in the following areas (in order of priority)

- Contribute to the Team Score
- Gain an All Around Medal
- Gain an Apparatus Medal

Appeals Process for NL10, Future, Developing and Senior International Team Selection

1. Eligibility
 - 1.1. A Club wishing to appeal the decision with regards to the selection of the WAG Level 10, Future, Developing or Senior State Team may only lodge a formal appeal on one or more of the following grounds:
 - a. failure to properly apply a GNSW bylaw, policy or selection process; or
 - b. administrative error
2. Procedures
 - 2.1. Subject to clause 1, Clubs may lodge an appeal in writing, to the WAG High Performance Manager. The application shall:
 - a. be lodged by the Club and not by a gymnast, parent, or a coach acting without the authority of the Club;
 - b. be lodged by 9.00am on Monday following the Senior State Championships (due to GA entry requirements)
 - c. include the name and contact details of the Club and the athlete who is the subject of the appeal; and
 - d. state the nature of the appeal, where the Club believes that an error has been made, and the remedy or resolution sought.
 - 2.2. Where an appeal has been received the WAG Technical Director or WAG High Performance Manager, in their complete discretion, may:
 - a. refer the matter to the WAG Gymsport Committee for consideration,
 - b. in circumstances where an administrative error is discovered, make a determination to change the composition of the level 10, Future, Junior or Senior State Team to reflect the correct team should any error not have occurred,
 - c. dismiss the matter on the basis that it is:
 - frivolous,
 - vexatious,
 - ineligible,
 - based upon insufficient grounds, or



- without sufficient supporting evidence.
- 2.3. The Gymsport Committee shall act in accordance with meeting operations as set out in the Committees Policy.
- 2.4. The decision by the Technical Director or WAG High Performance Manager (2.2 b, 2.2 c), or Gymsport Committee (2.2 a), shall be binding without any further right of appeal for any parties.

Any combination of the gymnast's top two (2) All Around scores from Trial 1, Trial 2 or State Championships, will be combined to determine the gymnast's ranking for Levels 8 and 9. Level 7 teams will be selected from the Border Challenge Trial only.

Level 8 and Level 9

Following the conclusion of the Senior State Championships the gymnasts ranked 9-14 in Level 8 and Level 9 from the above criteria who have completed the expression of interest will be announced in the team.

Level 7

Pending the entry information from Gymnastics QLD, where 2 teams are permitted in Level 7 they will be selected from the Border Challenge Trial only. Where 2 teams are eligible for selection the gymnasts ranked 1-5 will be named in the first team with gymnasts ranked 6-10 being named into the second team.
