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1 Definitions and Interpretations

2 Policies and Rules

2.1 Purpose

The purpose of these Technical Regulations is to provide the broader gymnastics community with an overview of the technical rules, competition formats and general information about Women's Artistic Gymnastics and its various divisions for use within Australia.

These Technical Regulations also provide guidance and governance to ensure that competitions are carried out in accordance with all relevant FIG rules and policies, as well as the rules for Women's Artistic Gymnastics in Australia. For a full list of policies and rules which should be read in conjunction with these Technical Regulations, please see the section below.

These rules should be referred to as appropriate for Australian Championships and National Clubs Carnival.

In addition to the above, all individuals involved in our sport are required to comply with all Gymnastics Australia National Policies, procedures and expected behaviours in order to provide a safe, welcoming and empowering environment for all members. Under the National Integrity Framework, any individual involved in the sport of gymnastics is required to raise a concern regarding the welfare of a child or inappropriate behaviour with Sport Integrity Australia. Failure to report such concerns to Sport Integrity Australia is considered a breach of the National Integrity Framework.

Any modification to these will be circulated in writing on the authority of Gymnastics Australia and where applicable, the National Commission.

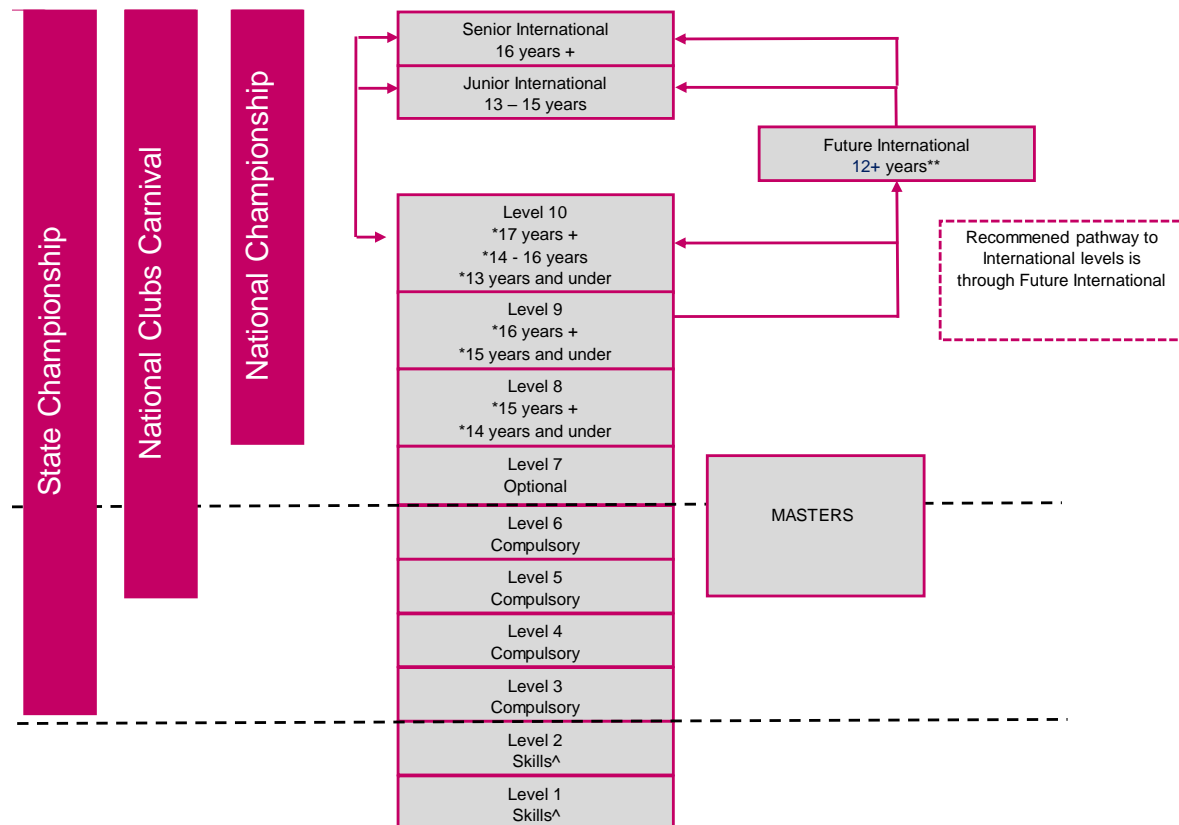

6 Event Rules and Regulations

Gymnastics Australia prioritises the health, safety, and wellbeing of all involved in National events.

Final decisions on event delivery and operations will be made based on credible evidence and in line with Federal and State guidelines and restrictions with regards to Force Majeure events ie COVID-19, extreme weather events or any other extenuating circumstance.

6.1 Applicable Regulations

Competitions will be conducted in accordance with the rules as listed in 2. Policies and Rules unless specific variations are listed below.

6.1.1 Music

- Music must be submitted using the format and naming protocol and the date set out in the Event Bulletin. Failure to do so will incur a fine of \$60.
- Any changes to music after the submission date will incur a change fee of \$60.
- Coaches/athletes must also bring a copy of their music on USB to the event in case of technical difficulties.
- Selected music must comply with OneMusic regulations. See [here](#) for details.

6.1.2 Age Restrictions

- The minimum age for an athlete to compete in the Australian Championships is 11 years of age in the year of the event.
- The minimum age for an athlete to compete in the National Clubs Carnival is 8 years of age in the year of the event.

7 Coaches

7.1 Requirements

- The number of coaches on the floor may not exceed the number of competing athletes from each STA/Club. Where a STA/Club has a single athlete competing, they may be accompanied by 2 coaches.
- All coaches must be appropriately attired as per the GA Uniform Policy.
- Coaches, whilst on the competition floor, must not video or photograph any athlete during the competition or warm up.
- Coaches must be actively coaching, such as moving a board/mat, spotting during warm-up, adjusting bars etc. in order to remain on the competition floor. Otherwise, coaches should be seated in the designated seating area at the apparatus.
- Any coach who is not actively coaching will be asked to leave the competition floor.
- Any coach not abiding by the accepted professional behavior will be asked to leave the competition floor for the duration of the competition. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Sitting/leaning on the podium at any time
 - Using/talking on a mobile phone
 - Interfering with judges

8 Judges

8.1 Behaviour

Gymnastics Australia takes seriously its responsibility to ensure all National Events are delivered in a safe, inclusive and fair environment. All individuals attending a National Event in a judging capacity are required to uphold the standards of behaviour as outlined in Gymnastics Australia's National Policies and the Judges Oath.

Delivered at Judges briefings, the Judges Oath acknowledges the integral role Judges contribute to the success of National Events, and recognises the importance of acting with honesty, fairness and integrity when judging Women's Artistic Gymnastics:

'On my word of honour, I declare as a judge, I will be guided by the spirit of fairness and dignity in sport. I pledge to evaluate the exercises shown conscientiously, without regard for the person, Club or State.'

In relation to serious incompetence, displays of inappropriate behaviour not in accordance with Gymnastics Australia's National Policies or the Judge's Oath, the following process must be adhered to:

- The National Judging Coordinator or Technical Director will give the first warning as verbal. GA's Events and Integrity teams must also be notified as soon as practicable.
- A second warning for ongoing incompetence or inappropriate behaviour will be provided by GA's Integrity team. The determination of necessary consequences, including, but not limited

to, suspension from judging for the remainder of the session or event, will be at the discretion of the GM Integrity (or their delegate).

In accordance with the National Integrity Framework, all concerns regarding serious incompetence or displays of inappropriate behaviour must be reported to Sport Integrity Australia.

8.2 General Requirements

- STA/Clubs must nominate appropriately qualified and accredited judges with definitive entries.
- STA/Clubs must provide a minimum number of appropriately qualified judges per the requirements outlined in Clause 8.8.1
- All judges must be available to judge all sessions that they are nominated to judge for at the event.
- Should a level/division be split across multiple sessions, the nominated judges must be available to attend all sessions for that level.
- Options or exemptions to the judging requirements can be discussed with the NJC and the GA events team prior to the submission of definitive entries.
- All judges must complete the required GA prescribed integrity courses and or requirements prior to the competition.
- All judges must attend the relevant judges' briefing and any other meetings as advised in the Event Bulletins.
- All judges must complete all pre-event requirements including but not limited to completion of the Interests register, and event specific online courses, presentations and or webinars.
- Judging panel allocations will be distributed by the NJC prior to the commencement of the competition.
- Allocation to judging panels will depend on number of judges and level of accreditation and management of declared Conflicts of Interest - see Clause 8.8 for detail.

8.3 Judging - International Stream

- The International Stream judging panel/s will consist of qualified FIG Brevet Judges and Advanced Silver Judges. Other judging roles, such as Score Secretary, Line Judge, Runner, can be filled by Advanced (Adv) judges.
- The composition of judging panel/s will conform to the prevailing FIG Code of Points. At National competitions - modifications to this format at National Competitions may only be made by the National Judging Coordinator and National Technical Director at the written direction of GA Events and Integrity teams, when there are not enough FIG Brevet/Advanced Silver Judges available or other factors such as the need to balance the panel with regards to club / state.

8.4 Judging - National Levels Events

- The National Levels Program competition judging panel/s will consist of qualified Judges. See Table 8.8.1 for Judging Accreditation and corresponding roles by level.

- The composition of judging panel/s will conform to the prevailing ALP Manual. At National competitions - modifications to this format at National Competitions may only be made by the National Judging Coordinator and National Technical Director at the written direction of GA Events and Integrity teams, when there are not enough FIG Brevet Judges available or other factors such as the need to balance the panel with regards to club / state.
- Support judging roles, such as Score Secretary, Line Judge, Runner, can be filled by Intermediate (Int) judges or higher (min. Advanced for AGC).
- The most experienced Advanced or higher judges available shall be selected for judging at the Australian Championships.

8.5 Judging - State Events

- State competition judging panel/s will consist of a minimum of 2 qualified Judges
- State Judging Coordinators will be required to submit panels to National Judging Coordinator for verification when qualifications for Australian Championships are being held.
- Support judging roles, such as Score Secretary & Runner, will be performed by qualified Judges and can be any level of judging accreditation.

8.6 Judge Numbers

- STA/Clubs must nominate all appropriately qualified and accredited judges with definitive entries as per the information below.

8.6.1 Australian Championships

For the Australian Championships, if the event a STA has an insufficient number of judges qualified and accredited at the relevant level, a request for an exemption to supply the required number of judges may be made to the National Judging Coordinator prior to the close of Definitive Entries. In the event of an exemption being granted, the NJC will notify the organization and the GA Events team in writing.

8.6.1 National Clubs Carnival

- Clubs must provide at least one judge per team per level with definitive entries.
- Clubs with less than 2 athletes within in a level do not need to nominate a judge for that level.

For the National Clubs Carnival, should a club be unable to provide the required number of judges for the event, the club will be charged the judges fine as outlines in the Event Bulletin. A request for an exemption to supply the required number of judges may be made to the GA events team prior to the close of Definitive Entries. In the event of an exemption being granted, the GA events team will notify the club and the NJC in writing.

8.7 Fines

Failure to nominate/provide the required number of judges at definitive entries will result in the relevant organisation being issued a fine as advised in Event Bulletins by GA event staff.

8.8 Judge Allocations

- Judges are appointed as per the requirements for each event (see tables in Section X – referring back to judge numbers section)
- NJC will undertake judge allocation process prior to each event
 - Allocation to judging panels will take into account the number of judges, level of accreditation and previous experience.
 - Where judges have been approved to undertake multiple roles at an event, allocations will be made to remove/minimise potential conflicts of interest
 - For example Judges with an International athlete may be allocated to Levels judging
 - Judging panel allocations will be published by the NJC prior to the commencement of the competition.

8.9 National Judges Subsidy Funding Criteria

This policy is applicable to Australian Championships - see Australian Championships Judges Subsidy Policy on Gymnastics Australia's website [here](#).

9 Inquiry of the Score

From time to time, there may be a discrepancy about the score awarded to a routine or skill, of which can be raised as inquiry for review. There are restrictions about the handling and management of inquiries, as detailed below:

9.1 What can be inquired?

Only Inquiries that relate to an athlete's difficulty score will be permitted.

Inquiries that relate to a comparison between judges/judging panels, comparison between athletes and/or groups, comparison to other events/competitions or execution scores (including Artistry) will not be accepted.

9.2 Who can inquire?

The Inquiry can only be lodged by the STA/Club coach on behalf of the athlete they represent. Each STA (Aust Champs) or Club (NCC) must nominate one coach per level to submit the D score inquiry.

9.3 How can an inquiry be made?

- Verbal notice of intention to lodge an inquiry must be directed to the TD or NJC (or appointed representative) who will provide the official Inquiry Form to be completed.

- Following the verbal notice of intent, the Inquiry form must be completed, and contain the competitor names, number, discipline and routine, as well as the name and signature of the coach.
- The Inquiry Form (available as advised at event Orientation meetings) must be completed and submitted to the TD or NJC or appointed representative

9.4 What is the time frame for submissions?

- Verbal notice must be made by the end of the rotation in question.
 - For the last gymnast of a rotation, inquiries must be made before the 1st gymnast of the next rotation starts competing.
 - For the last gymnast of the session, inquiries must be made within one minute after the gymnast's score is displayed
- Written inquiry to be submitted within five minutes of the verbal notice of intention.

9.5 Who will receive the inquiry?

- The inquiry must be submitted to the NJC (or nominated representative) via the competition floor manager, Event Management or NTD. The time of submission must be received by the individual receiving the form.

9.6 What happens once an inquiry has been submitted?

- NJC will respond to Inquiries as soon as practical/at the end of the rotation/session in which the inquiry was made.
- If required, a jury will be formed as per clause 9.8.

Inquiry action:

- If the inquiry is upheld, the fee per inquiry will not be applied, and the score will be adjusted accordingly. For Australian Championships the inquiry will not be included in the count of 4 allowed inquiries as per Clause 9.7.1.
- If the inquiry is dismissed, the fee will be invoiced to the relevant organisation and the score stands.
- In either case the written inquiry will be marked with the Jury's decision, signed by the NJC or their representative and a copy will be returned to the submitting coach.
- Decisions by the Jury will be final and without further discussion.
- Fees from overruled inquiries become income for the event. The fee per unsuccessful inquiry is \$100 – payable post event on invoice from GA.

9.7 Number of inquiries:

9.7.1 Australian Championships

- Each STA is permitted to inquire into the D score a maximum of 4 times unsuccessfully per level during the Team competition (Day 1) at Australian Championships at no cost. The 5th and each subsequent inquiry will incur a fee of \$100.
- For individual athletes who are additional to the State team and Day 2 of competition, there is a limit of 1 unsuccessful D score inquiry per athlete at no cost. Second and each subsequent unsuccessful inquiry will incur a fee of \$100.

- Fee will be charged back to the respective STA following the competition.

9.7.2 National Clubs Carnival

- There is no limit to the number of inquiries into D score at National Clubs Carnival.

9.8 Jury of Appeal

9.8.1 Composition of the Jury

As applies to Australian Championships, the Jury will consist of as least two of the following:

- National Technical Director or their appointed representative
- National Judging Coordinator or their appointed representative
- D1 of the apparatus involved in the determination of the score

9.8.2 Jury Role

- The administration of justice in cases of Inquiries is the responsibility of the Jury.
- They are empowered to consider and resolve all inquiries concerning matters of judging and correctness of arithmetical calculations. There is an entitlement of inquiry for a review of the Difficulty Score and Final score.
- Inquiries are discussed at a place away from spectators, coaches, officials and competitors.
- The Jury may request the use of the official video.
- If the displayed mark is upheld the Coach or a nominated representative is informed and given the reason for the decision.

10 Australian Championships – Rules and Regulations

10.1 Entries

The following apply to ALL entries for Australian Gymnastics Championships:

- All Athletes must be entered by Definitive Entries
- All athletes must be registered in the National database in their respective level at the time of Definitive Entries.
- Senior athletes cannot enter in a division which is lower than that in which they have competed Nationally or Internationally in the 6 months preceding either Australian Championships or National Clubs competitions.

10.1.1 Team Entries

- A maximum of one team per STA may be entered at any level.
- Only reserve athletes nominated at close of Definitive entries can replace injured or withdrawn athletes in the Level 8 and Level 9 teams.
 - STA can name up to 4 reserves at Level 8 & 9
 - STA can name up to 3 reserves at Level 10
- Teams for levels 8 & 9 must be named with definitive entries
- All other teams (Level 10, FI, JI & SI) must be named by the nominated date as stated in event bulletin

- STA's must submit a final team sheet, with the team members listed, by the nominated date as stated in event bulletin.
- No changes to team orders or team members are permitted unless there is an injury/illness and the athlete is withdrawn from the competition.

10.1.2 Individual Entries

- Senior, Junior, Level 10, Future International – All athletes who achieve the minimum qualifying score for entry to Australian Championships may be entered. There is no limit to the number of athletes who can be entered from any STA in these Levels/Divisions.

10.2 Qualification Process for Entry

- Refer to section 10.5.1.1 for Qualification Process details
- Refer to section 10.5.1.2 for Qualification requirements (Individual Level 10's, Future, Junior & Senior International)

10.2.1 Qualification into Australian Championship Finals

- Level 8 & 9 athletes who place in the top 32 AA on day 1 will qualify for competition on day 2 (finals). If any State does not have a min. of 2 athletes within the top 32, then the top ranked athletes from the respective STA will be added (additional to the 32). If an athlete placed within the top 8 on any apparatus, but has not qualified within the top 32 AA, they will be included into finals just for that apparatus.
- Level 10, Future, Junior and Senior International athletes, who compete day 1 will automatically qualify for day 2 of competition.

10.3 Australian Championships Competition format

- Gymnastics Australia reserves the right to alter the competition format at any time and this will be advertised in the Event Bulletin. All competition formats are subject to change and will be notified via official communication channels if necessary.
- All athletes in each level will receive the same warm-up opportunity. General warm-up may be conducted outside the competition hall if deemed necessary for the smooth running of the competition.
- The day and time of the competition for any level is subject to change and will be advertised in the event bulletin.
- Specific Warm-up format for each level will be notified via the Event Bulletin for Australian Championships.
- Levels 8 and 9 Finals: All athletes will be ranked according to individual All Around scores and top 32 will compete in reverse rank order on day 2 finals. If for any reason Gymnastics Australia deviates from this, States will be notified via official communications.
- Level 10 day 2 finals will be conducted in two sessions (where numbers permit):
 - Athletes in 16 and under age group will compete in one session of finals (including athletes in 13 and under age group).
 - Athletes in 17 and over age group will compete in a second session of finals.
- Athletes who request and are granted permission for the bars to be raised to (HB 260 or 270 cm / LB 180 or 190 cm) **may** be allocated a different competition order on bars but remain within their group to facilitate the smooth running of the competition. This will be done at the discretion of Competition Management and coaches will be notified accordingly.

10.4 Awards

- Specific awards and categories are outlined in APPENDIX 1: Australian Championships Rules and Awards Summary
- International competitors & competitions held within the Australian Gymnastics Championships
 - Any invited international athletes competing at the Australian Gymnastics Championships will be able to participate in the event, however, will not be eligible to receive Australian Championship awards.
 - International athletes will only be invited to attend should the event schedule allow it.
 - If an international event is combined with the Australian Championships awards will be decided by the event organisers.
- Artistry Award – awarded to a Level 8, Level 9 and a Level 10 athlete at Australian Championships for artistry on floor. The athlete will demonstrate an athlete's ability to transform her floor exercise from a well-structured composition into an artistic performance. She will demonstrate strong choreographic flow, artistry, expressiveness, musicality and excellent technique.
 - The D judges on floor during Australian Championships Day 1 competition will nominate all athletes who exhibit these artistic qualities, final selection will be made by the Technical Director and the Judging Co-ordinator after consultation with the WAG Commission members.
 - The decision will be final, and no appeal will be permitted.

10.4.1 Ties

- Where a tie is awarded the tied recipients, each receive the relevant award (trophy/medal/recognition item).
- The next place is not awarded, for example, where there is a tie for 2nd place, two awards will be presented for 2nd, but no 3rd place awarded.

10.5 Age & Qualification Requirements

10.5.1 Eligibility and Qualification Process for Australian Championships

10.5.1.1 Qualification Process

- States are responsible for the selection of their States Teams. Only athletes that meet the qualification requirements in Table 1 under the required conditions (Individual Level 10's, Future, Junior & Senior International) or have passed the relevant level (Level 8, 9 & 10 Team members) can be nominated by their State.
- States are required to follow their own published Technical Regulations for selection of their Teams for Australian Championships. Changes made after competitions have commenced or failure to follow them may result in their State Team entries not being accepted by Gymnastics Australia.

10.5.1.2 Qualification requirements (Individual Level 10's, Future, Junior & Senior International)

Qualification scores must be achieved under the following conditions:

- Equipment as per 5.1[^]
- Permitted required/additional matting as per 5.1 – where 5.1 is not followed appropriate deductions need to be applied
- Scores attained in 1 session of competition at a State or National sanctioned event that is listed on the State/Territory/GA competition calendar in 2023 OR while competing in a Junior/Senior Australian Team at an official FIG sanctioned event in 2023.
- Judged by appropriately qualified judges (min 2 per app)**

[^] State/Territories that cannot meet all the Equipment requirements must advise the WAG National Commission before the qualification event (with explanation and pictures of proposed set-up). The WAG National Commission must endorse the alternative set-up. Failing to engage with the WAG National Commission as appropriate may result in the athlete entries not being accepted by Gymnastics Australia.

**State/Territories that do not have appropriately qualified Judges to assess gymnasts for the purpose of qualification to National events may make an application to the WAG National Commission for the gymnasts to be assessed by proxy. Queries about applications should be directed to the National Judging Coordinator.

11.2 Competition Rules

- All competition rules will be as per 2. Policies and Rules unless otherwise specified by Gymnastics Australia.
- All competition equipment will be FIG standard except where specified in the WAG ALP Manual V3.2 and the event information refer 6.1.4.
- Gymnasts may only compete for the club they are registered to in the national database at the time of definitive entries.
- Gymnasts may compete in one of the above divisions only.
- All athletes will compete on Day 1 and Day 2.
- Gymnasts may compete in the level they are qualified for or higher.
- All athletes will be required to wear their club approved leotard and tracksuit
- All teams must be named at the time of definitive entries. Changes to teams can only occur if there is an injury and athlete withdrawal. An opportunity for Clubs to move athletes between their teams will be indicated in the Event Bulletin(s). Such an opportunity is not guaranteed. Only nominated reserve athletes can be entered as replacement athletes.
- Reserve athletes must be named at the time of definitive entries
- An athlete named in “Team Lime” can also be named as a reserve athlete for “Team Magenta”. Should this athlete replace an injured athlete in “Team Magenta” they will no longer be a member of “Team Lime” and can be replaced by a named reserve for “Team Lime”.
- Team awards will be given to full teams only (i.e. minimum 3 scores on all apparatus).
- The team total for each day will be determined by the total of the 3 highest scores on each of the four apparatus.
- Points for the Champion Club Award will be determined by the combined team total of all levels.
- The award/s will be decided by accumulation of points as specified in 11.4.1.

- It is expected that all athletes attend their award ceremony.
- Levels 5, 6 and 7
 - team awards will be Day 2 scores only. See Summary Table Appendix 2 for additional details.
- Levels 8, 9 and 10
 - If the number of entries allow for a single judging panel, scores will be combined for all results (Day 1 and Day 2 scores combined).
 - If the number of entries exceed the number for a single judging panel, team awards will be Day 2 scores only See Summary Table Appendix 2 for additional details
 - Information about single or double apparatus competition will be published in the event bulletin after definitive entries close.
- Future International, Junior and Senior
 - All athletes will compete on Day 1 and Day 2 and scores will be combined for all results and awards.
- Mixed Teams
 - Should clubs have less than three athletes in a particular level a mixed team can be formed.
 - Clubs are not eligible to enter a mixed team if they already have a team completing in the respective level.
 - Clubs may organise a mixed team prior to the close of definitive entries or opt for GA to coordinate a team after the close of definitive entries.
 - If clubs opt for GA to coordinate, clubs will be notified of their team composition approximately 1 week after the close of definitive entries.
 - Mixed teams are eligible for all team awards however they are not eligible to earn points for the overall club award.

- Spieth springboards with 7 springs (hard) and 5 springs (soft) will be available.
- All other equipment will be as per 6.1.4 2023 WAG Technical Regulations.
- Athletes must request in writing to raise the bars (HB 260 or 270 cm) by the date listed in the Event Bulletins. Athletes who request and are granted permission for the bars to be raised **may** be allocated a different competition order to facilitate the smooth running of the competition.
